- If you are aren't sure who your academic advisor is, contact our administrative assistant, [Nadine Keith](#).


Important dates and what they mean

You can find all important calendar dates on the Registrar's webpage [here](#). Here are some important dates for **Winter 2025**:

January 6th	First day of classes, fee payment deadline
January 15th	Last day to add/change any Winter course sections. Last day to withdraw from a Winter course without a "W" appearing on the transcript.
February 6th	April exam schedule posted (don't make travel plans before this!)
February 17th	Heritage Day – no classes
February 18th – 21st	Study break (aka reading week) – no classes
March 21st	Last day to withdraw from a Winter term course and receive a "W". Any Winter course withdrawals after today will receive an "F" grade.
April 4th	Last day of classes
April 7th	Exams start
April 17th	Exams end
April 18th	Residences close (noon)

If you withdraw from a course between January 6th and March 21st, the course will appear on your transcript with a "W" (which means "withdrew") next to it. If you withdraw from a course after March 21st, the course will appear on your transcript with an "F" next to it

Microsoft Teams is a collaboration space mainly used for online classes, online office hours, and online meetings.

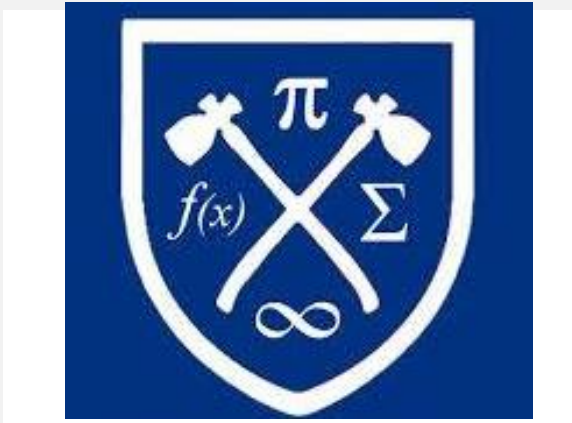


Make sure to **check your Acadia email address regularly**. This is your official email address for communication with the university and it is one of the ways your course instructors will convey important information!

Tips for emailing your course instructors:

- Until invited otherwise, address your course instructors formally using the appropriate academic or professional title (Dr. XYZ, for example)
- Be polite!
- Check your spelling and punctuation!
- Include the relevant course code and course name somewhere in your email

Math Mentor Program

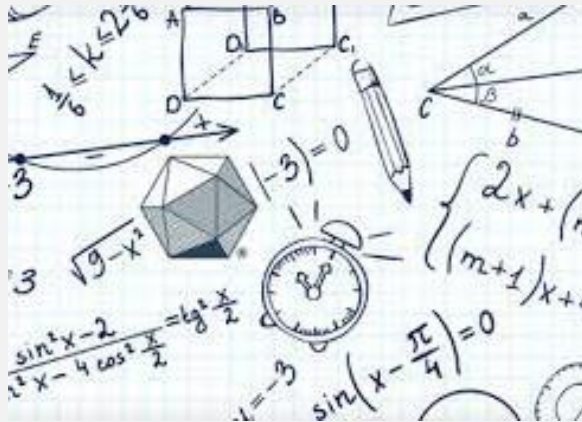
This program, run by the Math Society, pairs new math and stats students with senior student mentors to help them get the most out of their studies at Acadia.

Academic Probation:

Any student who obtains a sessional grade point average of at least 1.00 and less than 1.50, and who has not already incurred probation, will be placed on academic probation, but is eligible to re-register. Students on probation may be placed on a reduced course load and are required to participate in the Academic Success and Support Program (ASSP).

Academic Dismissal:

- Any student who obtains a sessional grade point average less than 1.00 will be placed on dismissal.
- Any student placed on probation and registered in more than 15h in the succeeding fall/winter session who obtains a sessional grade point average less than 1.50 will be placed on dismissal.

Academic Integrity

Responsible use of the work of other scholars

- Acadia has strict policies surrounding academic integrity which can be found [here](#)
- Penalties range from re-doing a piece of work to dismissal from the university
- Breaches of academic integrity include plagiarism and cheating
- A few examples:
 - Unauthorized use of AI (such as ChatGPT)
 - Use of online homework platforms (such as Chegg, Course Hero)
 - Copying from another student
 - Submitting someone else's work as your own
 - Unauthorized communication with another student or use of a phone during a test or exam
